CHAPTER 173.

AN ACT to amend section 931, of the Revised Statutes, relating to the establishment of free libraries.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 931, of the Revised Statutes of Wisconsin, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 931. The common council of every city not exceeding in population fifty thousand inhabitants, and the village board or board of trustees of every village, and the town board of every town containing over two thousand inhabitants, shall have power to establish and maintain a public library and reading room, and for such purpose may annually levy and cause to be collected as other general taxes are collected, a tax not exceeding one mill on each dollar of the taxable property of such city, town or village, or may set aside and appropriate a sum not to exceed ten per cent. of the money received in any year for license issued for vending or dealing in spirituous, vinous or fermented liquors, to constitute a library fund, which fund shall be kept by the treasurer, separate and apart from other money of the city, town or village, and be used exclusively for such purposes; provided, that no tax shall be levied without the same be first submitted to a vote, and be approved by a majority of the electors of such city, town or village.
