CHAPTER 283.

AN ACT to allow certain towns in Forest county to raise moneys for school purposes.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. In addition to the moneys heretofore authorized and allowed to be raised, the towns of Crandon and Gagen, in the county of Forest, are hereby authorized and allowed to raise and expend in each of said towns, the sums of three hundred dollars, in the town of Crandon, and five hundred in the town of Gagen, annually hereafter, for school purposes.

May raise and expend money for school purposes.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 284.

AN ACT placing roads within a town under the management of the town board, and requiring town road taxes to be paid in money, and providing for the appointment of road superintendents.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The town board of each town in this state shall have the full supervision, management and control of the making and repairing of all roads in said town, except such as are, or may hereafter be, put under the jurisdiction of the county by any law of this state, and may make and repair the same by hire or contract, and for that purpose may annually appoint a
