CHAPTER 64.

AN ACT to punish trespass upon public lands.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Trespass, of what to consist. SECTION 1. Any person who shall cut down, injure or destroy any tree or timber growing or standing upon land belonging to or mortgaged to or held in trust by the state, or who shall take and carry away any timber or wood so cut or severed, or previously cut or severed and remaining upon said land, or who shall take or carry away any mineral, earth or stone from such land, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail not more than six months, or by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars.

Penalty.

SECTION 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
