

Town meeting. SECTION 3. The first town meeting in said town of Underhill shall be held on the first Tuesday of April, 1893, at the postoffice at Underhill, and the inspectors of said town meeting shall be Robert Hintz, Rasmus Larsen, and Henry Dicke, if present at the time and place appointed, or if not present, the person or persons necessary to fill any vacancy shall be selected by the electors of said town present at such time and place; and the requisite number of clerks for such town meeting shall be chosen by such electors from the persons present at such time and place.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force on and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 7.

AN ACT to repeal chapter 439 of the laws of 1891, entitled "An act to provide for the regulation, control and government of election primaries in counties having a population exceeding one hundred and fifty thousand inhabitants."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Repeals ch.
439, laws of
1891.

SECTION 1. Chapter 439, of the laws of 1891, entitled, "An act to provide for the regulation, control and government of election primaries in counties having a population exceeding one hundred and fifty thousand inhabitants", is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
