

delivery to him of a receipt therefor, containing a release of all demands against the state or any of its officers or employes, by reason of the injuries sustained by the said Lizzie Seymour at the state school for dependent and neglected children on the fifth day of December, 1892.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 157.

AN ACT for the preservation of fish in Beaver creek, in Jackson county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. No person or persons shall be allowed to fish for, take, catch or kill with any device whatever any fish in the stream known as the north branch of Beaver creek, or in its tributaries, in the town of Franklin, in the county of Jackson, in this state, for the period of two years from the fifteenth day of April, 1895; nor shall any person or persons sell, or offer for sale, or buy, or have in their possession, any such fish caught or taken from such stream or its tributaries for such period of two years.

Close time in Beaver creek for catching fish.

SECTION 2. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this act, shall, on conviction thereof, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and be fined not less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars, with the costs of prosecution.

Penalty for violating.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
