## CHAPTER 36.

AN ACT to provide for the employment of a stenographic reporter in certain cases.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Whenever the judge of any circuit court in this state shall call in another circuit judge to hold court in his circuit, and in consequence thereof, court shall be held by two judges at the same time, the regularly appointed reporter of that circuit shall be and hereby is directed and empowered to employ a reporter to attend upon the court so held by such outside judge and report the proceedings thereof.

Employment of extra stenographic reporter, when.

SECTION 2. The compensation of such reporter shall be ten dollars per day for each day he shall attend such court, and be paid by the county in the same manner as other court expenses are paid. And whenever a transcript of any proceeding in such court shall be ordered by any of the parties to an action, he shall make and furnish such transcript, and may charge and collect therefor from the party so ordering, the sum of five cents per folio.

Compensation.

SECTION 3. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.
