CHAPTER 377.

AN ACT to provide for an additional circuit judge in and for the second judicial circuit.

Whereas, section seven, of article seven, of the constitution of Wisconsin has been amended so as to read as follows:

of Constitutional provision relating to circuit courts.

“Section seven. For each circuit there shall be chosen by the qualified electors thereof one circuit judge, except that in any circuit composed of one county only, which county shall contain a population according to the last state or United States census of one hundred thousand inhabitants or over, the legislature may, from time to time, authorize additional circuit judges to be chosen. Every circuit judge shall reside in the circuit from which he is elected, and shall hold his office for such term, and receive such compensation as the legislature shall prescribe;”

And whereas, The second judicial circuit is composed of one county only, to wit, the county of Milwaukee, containing more than one hundred thousand inhabitants according to both the last United States and the last state census;

And whereas, There is need for an additional circuit judge in and for said circuit; now, authorized.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Additional judge provided for second judicial circuit.

SECTION 1. An additional circuit judge in and for the second judicial circuit is hereby authorized.

SECTION 2. A special judicial election shall be held in and for said county of Milwaukee on the first Tuesday of April, A. D. 1899, according to law for the election of such additional circuit judge.

Term and salary of judge.

SECTION 3. Such additional circuit judge shall hold his office for a term of six years from the first Monday of January next succeeding his first election, and his successors shall each hold office for six years, and shall each be elected at the regular judicial election held in the last year of the preceding term. The judges of the second judicial circuit shall, on and after January first, A. D. 1900, receive a salary of five thousand dollars per annum payable as other circuit judges are paid, provided that the excess over the compensation of other circuit judges shall be paid by the county of Milwaukee in the same manner as the compensation of judges of the superior court is paid.

Board of supervisors to provide suitable court room.

SECTION 4. The board of supervisors of Milwaukee county shall provide a suitable court room wherein said additional circuit judge may hold court, and a suitable office wherein he may discharge his duties as a judge at chambers. The sheriff of said county shall provide a deputy sheriff whose duty it shall be to preserve order in the court held by such additional circuit judge, and the clerk of the circuit and superior courts of Milwaukee county shall furnish such court with a deputy clerk to keep the minutes of said court; and said sheriff and clerk are respectively hereby authorized to appoint such

deputies, not exceeding one each, and such deputies shall be compensated the same as other deputies assigned to the performance of like duties.

SECTION 5. Such additional circuit judge shall appoint a phonographic reporter for his court who shall be compensated the same as other phonographic reporters for circuit courts in this state.

Phonographic reporter.

SECTION 6. The two circuit judges of said circuit may act together or separately as they may determine, and may divide the cases upon the calendar of the circuit court of said county upon any arrangement which they may agree upon.

Business, how regulated.

SECTION 7. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 378.

AN ACT to appropriate to the persons therein named the sum of five hundred dollars each.

The people of the state of Wisconsin represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, to Arthur L. Sanborn, John R. Berryman, Daniel E. Riordan, Julius E. Roehr, John M. Whitehead, William H. Flett, David F. Jones, William G. Wheeler and Leslie C. Harvey the sum of five hundred dollars each.

Appropriation to revision committee.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
