

lars to be paid quarterly out of the treasury of Douglas county, provided that no judge of such superior court shall receive or be allowed to draw any salary for any quarter unless he shall take and subscribe an affidavit before an officer entitled to administer oaths that no cause in his court remains undecided that has been submitted for decision for the period of ninety days exclusive of the time that he shall have been actually disabled by sickness, which affidavit shall be presented to and filed with the officer whose duty it shall be to pay such salary.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 109.

AN ACT to amend section 6, chapter 125 of the laws of the state of Wisconsin for the year 1887, entitled, "An act for the establishment of a superior court in and for the county of Milwaukee."

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

Duties and salaries of judge. Oath of office.

SECTION 1. Section 6 of chapter 125 of the laws of Wisconsin for the year 1887 is hereby amended by adding thereto the following, to-wit: provided that no judge of such superior court shall receive or be allowed to draw any salary for any quarter unless he shall take and subscribe an affidavit before an officer entitled to administer oaths that no cause in his court remains undecided that has been submitted for de-

cision for the period of ninety days, exclusive of the time that he shall have been actually disabled by sickness, which affidavit shall be presented to and filed with the officer whose duty it shall be to pay such salary, so that said section when amended shall read as follows: Section 6. Every person elected or appointed judge of such superior court shall before entering upon the duties of his office, take and subscribe before some officer authorized to administer oaths and file in the office of the clerk of the circuit court of said county, duly certified, the following oath of office: "I do solemnly swear that I will support the constitution of the United States and the constitution of the state of Wisconsin, and that I will administer justice without respect to persons, and I will faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of the office of judge of the superior court of Milwaukee county according to the best of my ability," and he shall receive an annual salary of five thousand dollars to be paid quarterly out of the treasury of the said county, provided that no judge of such superior court shall receive or be allowed to draw any salary for any quarter unless he shall take and subscribe an affidavit before an officer entitled to administer oaths that no cause in his court remains undecided that has been submitted for decision for the period of ninety days, exclusive of the time that he shall have been actually disabled by sickness, which affidavit shall be presented to and filed with the officer whose duty it shall be to pay such salary.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
