## CHAPTER 347.

AN ACT to provide a penalty for failure, neglect or refusal by corporations to make and file reports and statements and keep books open for inspection, as now required by law.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

**Penalty.** SECTION 1. Any corporation required to make, file and keep the reports and statements provided for by section 1750 of the statutes of 1898, and to allow the inspection of its books and accounts and give the information provided for by section 1757 of said statutes, and any officer, manager, agent, director or trustee of such corporation who shall fail, neglect or refuse to fully and promptly perform and carry out the duties so imposed shall, in addition to all other existing penalties, forfeit not less than twenty-five nor more than one hundred dollars for each and every failure, neglect or refusal, to be collected by civil action in favor of any stockholder or creditor thereby aggrieved.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
