**CHAPTER 385.**

AN ACT to amend subsection 4 of section 37 of the statutes, relating to compensation for publication of election notices and information to voters.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Subsection 4 of section 37 of the statutes is amended to read: Section 37. 4. The compensation to be paid for all publications of such \* \* \* notices shall be sixty cents per square for weekly papers and one dollar per square for the first publication and thirty-five cents per square for such subsequent publication in daily papers, but the total shall in no case exceed the \* \* \* sum hereafter specified, to-wit: for a general election in weekly newspapers \* \* \* *one hundred* dollars, and in daily papers \* \* \* *two hundred* dollars; for a judicial \* \* \* election in weekly newspapers \* \* \* *twenty-five* dollars and in daily newspapers \* \* \* *fifty* dollars; for a municipal election in weekly newspapers \* \* \* *fifty* dollars, in daily newspapers \* \* \* *one hundred* dollars which *in each case* shall cover all insertions required to be made; provided, that in cities of the first class and in counties containing more than two hundred thousand population the compensation for \* \* \* publishing all said \* \* \* notices shall be at the rate of one dollar per square for the first insertion, and seventy-five cents per square for the subsequent \* \* \* insertions. But nothing herein shall be so construed to require the publication of a separate notice to women voters at any election.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
