CHAPTER 438.

AN ACT to create section 4549t of the statutes, relating to the conduct of officers and employees of the state and providing a penalty.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is added to the statutes a new section to read: Section 4549t. No officer or employee of the state shall receive or accept from any person, firm or corporation any sum of money or other compensation other than such as is required by law to be collected and paid to the state for the furnishing of any information, or performance of any service whatever, relating in any manner to the duties of such officer or employee. Any person violating this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars, nor more than five hundred dollars, or more than six months' imprisonment in the county jail, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

CHAPTER 439.

AN ACT to amend section 1565 l of the statutes, relating to parties disqualified for license.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1565 l of the statutes is amended to read: Section 1565 l. From and after the first Tuesday in July, 1908, no license to sell, deal, or traffic in malt, ardent, spirituous, or intoxicating liquors shall be granted or issued to any person, *unless to a domestic corporation, not a full citizen of the United States and of this state and a resident of the town, village, or city in which such license is applied for, nor shall any such license be granted or issued to any person who has been convicted of an offense against the laws of this state punishable by imprisonment in the state prison, unless the person so committed has been duly pardoned.*

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
