CHAPTER 105.

AN ACT to create subsection 8, of section 1022—57, of the statutes, relating to the registration of certificates of death.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is added to section 1022—57 of the statutes a new subsection to read: (Section 1022—57) 8. Whenever there shall be filed with the state registrar of vital statistics a certificate of death of any resident of this state, who died without the state, the registrar shall forward to the register of deeds of the county in which such deceased person resided, a certified copy of such certificate of death, who shall make a proper record of the same.

CHAPTER 106.

AN ACT to amend section 523 of the statutes, relating to the organization of the town board of school directors.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 523 of the statutes is amended to read: Section 523. The members of the board, a majority of whom shall constitute a quorum, assembled at each annual meeting, shall elect from their number a president and a vice-president. *In case of a failure to organize on account of a tie vote, it shall be the duty of the town clerk, in case he is not a sub-district clerk, or if he be, the chairman of the town board of supervisors, to cast a deciding vote for the organization of the board and the election of a secretary, who may or may not be of their number, but who shall be a resident of the town and hold said office for one year or until his successor is elected. Such secretary shall receive compensation of not less than two nor more than three dollars per day for not to exceed twenty-five days in each school year, and the other members of the executive committee may, when the electors at the annual town meeting shall so decide, receive a compensation of two dollars per day for not to exceed*
