

shall perform the duties of the phonographic reporter, he shall receive the compensation provided by law for the phonographic reporter, the same to be deducted from the salary of the phonographic reporter.

4. Said reporter and assistant reporter shall furnish parties to an action, or their attorneys, requiring them, transcripts of the testimony and proceedings had at a price not to exceed five cents per folio. * * * Until otherwise fixed by the county board, the per diem compensation of said reporter and assistant reporter shall be paid out of the treasury of the county of Walworth upon the order of the judge.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 127.

AN ACT to amend the first paragraph of section 4560a—3 of the statutes, relating to the use of dip nets.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The first paragraph of section 4560a—3 of the statutes is amended to read: Section 4560a—3. It shall be unlawful and is hereby prohibited to set, use or operate, a dip net, in any of the inland waters of this state, except in the streams or rivers flowing into Lake Michigan within a distance of * * * ten miles of the shore of said lake, and in the east and west branches of the Fond du Lac river emptying into Lake Winnebago, within three miles of said lake, and in the waters herein enumerated, dip nets not to exceed fourteen feet in diameter with meshes not less than two-inch stretch measure, may be used only for the purpose of taking and catching buffalo fish, carp, celpout, garfish, redhorse and suckers.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
