CHAPTER 113.

AN ACT to amend section 1631k of the statutes, relating to bounties for crows, hawks, gophers, sparrows and rattlesnakes.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1631k of the statutes is amended to read: Section 1631k. *The county board of any county may by proper resolution direct that every person who shall kill any crow shall be entitled to a reward of not to exceed fifteen cents or any hen hawk twenty-five cents, or any pocket gopher twenty cents or any streaked gopher ten cents, or any English sparrow four cents, or any rattlesnake fifty cents. * * * The rewards herein provided shall be the maximum to which any person shall be entitled.*

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 114.

AN ACT to appropriate to Elizabeth A. Werner, John Jennings and Frank Jennings, a sum of money therein named.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is appropriated to Elizabeth A. Werner, John Jennings and Frank Jennings, as executors and trustees under the will of David Jennings, late of the city of New London, Wisconsin, deceased, out of any money of the general fund in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of two thousand one hundred forty-six dollars and sixty-five cents, in full for overpayment made by said executors, in November, 1907, to the state treasury, as an inheritance tax upon the transfer of the estate of said David Jennings, deceased.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
