CHAPTER 265.

AN ACT to amend section 1498—6 of the statutes, relating to hunting and fishing licenses, and providing a penalty.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1498—6 of the statutes is amended to read: Section 1498—6. It shall be the duty of each county clerk in this state to remit to the state treasurer, on the first day of each month, all moneys received by him for hunting or fishing licenses during the preceding month, and to report to the state fish and game warden the number of licenses issued, and the amount of money remitted to the state treasurer. He shall also keep * * * an index * * * of the names of all licensees in alphabetical order, said names to be entered at the time the licenses are issued. Any county clerk who shall fail or refuse to comply with any of the provisions of this section shall on conviction thereof pay a penalty of not less than five dollars nor more than ten dollars or by imprisonment in the county jail not less than five days nor more than ten days.

CHAPTER 266.

AN ACT to amend subdivision (7) of section 709, sections 1165, 1167, 1168, 1169, 1170, 1171, 1172, 1175 and 1176 of the statutes, relating to redemption of lands sold for taxes.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subdivision (7) of section 709, sections 1165, 1167, 1168, 1169, 1170, 1171, 1172, 1175 and 1176 of the statutes are amended to read: (Section 709) (7) To keep in such manner a separate account of all moneys paid the county treasurer by him. * * *
