CHAPTER 559.

AN ACT to create sections 4635a and 4635b and 4848—1 of the statutes, relating to punishment for crimes and extradition therefor.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Three new sections are added to the statutes to read: Section 4635a. Any person who commits an act or who omits to do an act which act or omission constitutes a part of a crime by the laws of this state shall be punished the same as if he had committed the whole of such crime within this state.

Section 4635b. Whenever a person, with intent to commit a crime, does any act or omits to do any act within this state in execution or part execution of such intent, which culminates in the commission of a crime, either within or without this state, such person is punishable for such crime in this state in the same manner as if the same had been committed entirely within this state.

Section 4848—1. 1. The governor of this state may demand of the executive authority of any other state, territory, or of the District of Columbia, the delivery over of any person charged in this state with the commission of any crime under the laws of this state, and whenever a demand is made for that purpose the same proceeding, so far as applicable, shall be had as if such demand was made for the return of a fugitive from justice.

2. Whenever the chief executive of any other state, territory, or of the District of Columbia, shall demand of the governor of this state the delivery over of any person charged in such state, territory or district with the commission of any crime therein, it shall be the duty of the governor to deliver over the person demanded as provided in section 4847 of the statutes, the same as if said person were a fugitive from justice.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
