CHAPTER 156.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money therein named to Mrs. Mollie Widell for services rendered as a member of the grain and warehouse commission.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the general fund to Mrs. Mollie Widell of Superior two hundred sixty-four dollars in payment for services rendered by her as a member of the Wisconsin grain and warehouse commission in January, 1927. Acceptance of this appropriation shall operate as a full settlement of all claims which said claimant has against the state for services rendered as a member of the Wisconsin grain and warehouse commission for which she has not heretofore been compensated.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 157.

AN ACT to amend paragraph (b) of subsection (11) of section 20.61 of the statutes, relating to state aid for county fairs.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (11) of section 20.61 of the statutes is amended to read: (20.61) (11) (b) After July 1, 1925, state aid shall be paid to only such counties as conduct fairs, and to but one society, board, or association in any county which does not conduct a fair, such society, board, or association to be designated by the county board of such county, except that societies, boards, or associations in counties having a population of * * * ten thousand or more according to the last federal census, which have received aid hereunder for fairs held during the calendar year 1920 may, upon compliance with the conditions prescribed by this subsection, continue to receive state aid until otherwise provided by law.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
