CHAPTER 509.

AN ACT to repeal paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of section 29.28 and subsection (1a) of section 29.285; to create paragraphs (oa), (qa) and (ua) and to amend paragraphs (e), (i), (l), (n) and (u) of subsection (1) of section 29.28 and section 29.205 of the statutes, relating to reconciliation of laws passed in 1929 upon ice fishing and to the closed season for certain fish in Trempealeau lakes in Trempealeau county.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of section 29.28 and subsection (1a) of section 29.285 of the statutes, created by chapters 338 and 208, laws of 1929, are repealed.

- SECTION 2. Three new paragraphs are added to subsection (1) of section 29.28 of the statutes (as created in chapter 338, laws of 1929) to read: (29.28) (1) (oa) Racine county: Bohner's lake; Tischigan lake and Tischigan marsh in sections ten, eleven, thirteen, fourteen and fifteen of township four north, range nineteen east, in the town of Waterford.
- (qa) Trempealeau county: Trempealeau lakes, commonly known as First, Second, Third and Round lakes.
- (ua) Waupaca county: White lake in the town of Royalton and Chain O' Lakes in the towns of Dayton and Farmington.
- Section 3. Paragraphs (e), (i), (l), (n) and (u) of subsection (1) of section 29.28 (as created in chapter 338, laws of 1929) and section 29.205 of the statutes are amended to read: (29.28)
- (1) (e) Forest county: Crane lake, Little Rice lake, North Lilly lake, Pickerel and Rolling Stone lakes.
- (i) Manitowoc county: Little Pigeon lake * * *, Pigeon lake and Wilke lake.
- (1) Oneida county: Pelican lake; Sugar Camp chain of lakes, Stone lake, Swamp lake, Silver lake, Dam lake, Sand lake, Echo lake or Chain lake, all of the last mentioned lakes being located in town thirty-eight north, range nine east and town thirty-nine north, range eight east; Post lake in Langlade and Oneida counties.
- (n) Polk county: Pike lake; Twin lakes in the town of Lincoln; Apple river from the dam of the North Supply Com-

pany in the city of Amery north to Ridler's dam in section twenty-eight in the town of Apple River.

(u) Waukesha county: Brown's lake in section thirty of township five north, range eighteen east; Eagle lake; Phantom and Howett's lakes.

29.205 No person shall take, catch, or kill, any fish, in that area in the waters of Lake Marinuka, Trempealeau county, located south of the place where trunk highway number eleven crosses Beaver creek to the dam of the Davis Milling Company, nor in the lakes known as Trempealeau lakes, situated south and east of Trempealeau, said lakes being commonly referred to as First, Second, Third and Round lakes, from March first to the first day of the bass season of each year. * No person shall fish in such waters with more than one line or pole or with more than one hook.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 510.

AN ACT to renumber subsections (a), (b) and (d) of section 20.42 to be subsections (1), (2) and (4), to amend subsection (1) (as renumbered) of said section 20.42 of the statutes, relating to the geological and natural history survey and making an appropriation.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsections (a), (b) and (d) of section 20.42 of the statutes are renumbered to be subsections (1), (2) and (4), respectively, of said section.

SECTION 2. Subsection (1) (as renumbered) of section 20.42 of the statutes is amended to read: (20.42) * * (1) Annually, beginning July 1, * * 1929, * * sixty thousand dollars, for the execution of its functions; of this there is allotted: Not to exceed fifteen thousand dollars annually for the preparation of a topographical map of the state of Wisconsin.
