

for fire protection, school purposes or vocational school purposes, or for refunding any of the bonds issued for any of the aforesaid purposes, until the proposition for their issue for the special purpose thereof shall have been submitted to the electors of such city and adopted by a majority voting thereon. Whenever the common council of any city shall declare its purpose to raise money by issuing bonds for any purpose other than those above specified it shall direct, by resolution, which shall be recorded at length in the record of its proceedings, the city clerk to call a special election for the purpose of submitting the question of bonding the city to the electors thereof. Such elections shall be noticed, conducted, canvassed and the result declared as provided in this subsection, except that the notice of such special election and the ballot used thereat need not embody a copy of the resolution, but shall contain a statement of the purpose and the amount of the bonds proposed to be issued.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 483.

AN ACT to amend section 311.17 of the statutes, relating to publication of notices of the receipt by the state treasurer of funds from public administrators.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 311.17 of the statutes is amended to read: 311.17 The state treasurer, upon the receipt of any money from a public administrator, shall forthwith advertise the fact in the state paper by giving the name of the deceased, the time and place of his death, the amount paid into the treasury, the public administrator paying the same and that the same will be paid to the heirs who had not before asserted claims thereto, without interest, on proof of heirship, if applied for within five years from the date of publication. * * * The cost of such advertising shall be charged to the appropriation for the treasury department.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
