Resolved, That this legislature requests the United States senators and members of Congress from this state to use their influence with the proper federal authorities to secure prompt action on the purchase of additional lands for federal forest purposes in this state, in order that Wisconsin may share equally with the other lake states in the federal reforestation work program. Be it further

Resolved, That properly attested copies of this resolution be sent to Honorable Robert Fechner, Director in Chief of the government's reforestation program, Honorable Henry A. Wallace, Secretary of Agriculture of the United States, Honorable R. Y. Stuart, Chief of the United States Forest Service, to each of the United States senators and members of Congress from this state.

JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to the appointment of a committee by the Governor to enable this state to take full advantage of the contemplated federal public works program to provide jobs for the unemployed.

WHEREAS, President Roosevelt, in a message to Congress on May 17, 1933, recommended legislation for a three billion three hundred million dollar public works program to create millions of jobs for the unemployed, and in such message, specifically stated that the bill should provide for co-operation with the states, under which a portion of the money appropriated may be used for necessary public works projects of state and local governments; and

WHEREAS, This is a project of which this state should take the fullest possible advantage, but it will be unable to do so unless carefully worked out plans are presented to the federal government for necessary public works projects within this state; and

WHEREAS, The Governor has already appointed several unofficial committees to develop plans for taking full advantage of federal relief measures passed by Congress, and these committees

are functioning to the great advantage of the state; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Assembly, the Senate concurring, That the legislature respectfully requests the Governor to promptly appoint an unofficial committee to develop plans for necessary public works projects to be undertaken in this state from funds made available by the federal public works bill which President Roosevelt has recommended to Congress. In constituting said committee, the Governor is requested to include thereon representative citizens of the state as well as state officers and employes of departments which will be directly affected by this program. Be it further

Resolved, That a properly attested copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Governor as promptly as possible after its adoption.

JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to cost of production for farmers.

WHEREAS, The Congress of the United States, it has been reported, struck out of the farm-relief bill the so-called "Simpson Amendment," which would have guaranteed prices to farmers equal to their actual and fair cost of production; and

WHEREAS, This action makes the national farm strike inevitable, which will probably cause discontent and distress; and

WHEREAS, The demand of the farmers for prices which will give them at least their cost of production is reasonable in all respects and is but plain justice; therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate, the Assembly concurring, That the Legislature of the State of Wisconsin respectfully memorializes the Congress of the United States to promptly enact legislation guaranteeing to farmers their reasonable cost of production. Be it further

Resolved, That properly attested copies of this resolution be transmitted to Honorable Henry A. Wallace, Secretary of Agriculture, and to both houses of the Congress of the United States and to each Wisconsin member thereof.
