CHAPTER 37

AN ACT to amend 59.96 (6) (a) of the statutes, relating to the power of the metropolitan sewerage commission to change watercourses within the county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

59.96 (6) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

59.96 (6) (a) The metropolitan sewerage commission shall project, plan and construct in such county outside of the city limits of such city of the first class but within the metropolitan sewerage district, main sewers, pumping and temporary disposal works for the collection and transmission of house, industrial and other sanitary sewage to and into the intercepting sewerage system of such district, and may improve any watercourse within the district by deepening and widening or otherwise changing the same where in the judgment of the commission it may be necessary in order to carry off surface or drainage water, and such power may be exercised outside the district in any case where any such watercourse flows from within the district to a point outside the district and then returns to the district, *and such power may be exercised outside the district in any case where any such watercourse flows from within the district to a point outside the district. Such commission is hereby authorized and empowered to enter into a contract with such municipality or with any other governmental body which owns or has control of any such lands through which such stream flows for the payment of such part of the cost of such improvement in such municipality which is wholly or partly outside of the district as the municipalities and governmental bodies involved may agree upon.*
