CHAPTER 210

AN ACT to amend 104.09; and to repeal and recreate 103.68 (3) of the statutes, relating to employment of women and minors.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 103.68 (3) of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

103.68 (3) At least 30 minutes shall be allowed for each meal period which shall commence reasonably close to 6 a.m., 12 m., 6 p.m. or 12 p.m. or approximately midway of any work period or at such other times as deemed reasonable by the commission. No minor under age 18 shall be employed or permitted to work more than 6 consecutive hours without a meal period.

SECTION 2. 104.09 of the statutes is amended to read:

104.09 RECORDS. ~~Every employer employing three or more females or minors shall register with the industrial commission, on blanks to be supplied by the commission. In filling out the blank he shall state separately the number of females and the number of minors employed by him, their age, sex, wages, and the nature of the work at which they are employed, and shall give such other information relative to the work performed and the wages received as the industrial commission requires. Each employer shall also keep a record of the names and addresses of all women and minors employed by him, the hours of employment and wages of each, and such other records as the industrial commission requires.~~
