CHAPTER 294, LAWS OF 1967

AN ACT to repeal 37.12 (1); to renumber 37.12 (2) and (3); to amend 37.12 (1), as renumbered; and to repeal and recreate 37.11 (5) of the statutes, relating to courses of instructions and textbooks at state colleges.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 37.11 (5) of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

37.11 (5) to prescribe the courses of study and the various books or works to be used in such courses and upon completion of a curriculum for the bachelor of arts, bachelor of science, master of arts, master of science and specialist or professional degrees in education to confer, with the approval of the co-ordinating committee under s. 39.03, degrees and to award diplomas in testimony thereof as are usual in colleges and universities.

SECTION 2. 37.12 (1) of the statutes is repealed:

SECTION 3. 37.12 (2) and (3) of the statutes are renumbered 37.12 (1) and (2), respectively, and 37.12 (1), as renumbered, is amended to read:

37.12 (1) The board shall maintain the necessary courses for the thorough instruction and training of teachers in the principles and practice of the industrial arts and of home economics and household arts at the Stout state college as 4 and 5 year college courses, and students who shall satisfactorily complete such courses shall receive the degree of bachelor or master of science with majors in industrial education, vocational education, in home economics education and home economics and industrial technology.
