1993 WISCONSIN ACT 355

AN ACT *to repeal* 116.03 (5); and *to amend* 116.04 (1) (a) 1 and 116.04 (1) (a) 2 of the statutes, **relating to:** the appointment of cooperative educational service agency administrators.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 116.03 (5) of the statutes is repealed.

SECTION 2. 116.04 (1) (a) 1. of the statutes is amended to read:

116.04 (1) (a) 1. ~~Beginning with the 1984-85 school year, and thereafter within a reasonable period of time after notice of a vacancy or impending vacancy by~~ Upon request of a board of control, the state superintendent shall submit to the board of control the names of at least 3 persons for possible appointment as agency administrator. Upon the request of the board of control, the state superintendent shall submit the names of 3 additional persons for possible appointment as agency administrator.

SECTION 3. 116.04 (1) (a) 2. of the statutes is amended to read:

116.04 (1) (a) 2. The board of control shall appoint and contract with ~~one of the persons~~ an agency administrator, who meets the qualifications established by the state superintendent by rule, for a term of not more than 3 years. The board of control may renew the agency administrator's contract for a term of not more than 3 years.

SECTION 4. Nonstatutory provisions. The state superintendent of public instruction shall conduct a study of cooperative educational service agencies, including their mission and their governance. By January 1, 1995, the state superintendent shall submit a report, including his or her findings and recommendations, to the appropriate standing committees of the legislature in the manner provided in section 13.172 (3) of the statutes.

SECTION 5. Effective dates. This act takes effect on July 1, 1995, except as follows:
