



**ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 2,
TO ASSEMBLY BILL 304**

October 29, 2019 – Offered by Representatives KOLSTE and SUBECK.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 **1.** Page 2, line 2: delete lines 2 and 3 and substitute:

3 “450.01 **(16)** (L) Prescribing and administering injectable hormonal
4 contraceptives and prescribing and dispensing self-administered hormonal
5 contraceptives pursuant to s. 450.095 (2m).”

6 **2.** Page 2, line 8: delete lines 8 to 15 and substitute:

7 “450.095 **(1)** (ag) “Injectable hormonal contraceptive” means a drug composed
8 of a hormone or a combination of hormones that is approved by the federal food and
9 drug administration to prevent pregnancy and that a health care practitioner
10 administers to the patient by injection.

11 (ar) “Self-administered hormonal contraceptive” means a drug composed of a
12 hormone or a combination of hormones that is approved by the federal food and drug
13 administration to prevent pregnancy and that the patient to whom the drug is

1 prescribed may self-administer. “Self-administered hormonal contraceptive”
2 includes hormonal contraceptive patches and hormonal contraceptive pills.”.

3 **3.** Page 3, line 2: delete the material beginning with “prescribe” and ending
4 with “contraceptives” on line 3 and substitute “prescribe and administer injectable
5 hormonal contraceptives and may prescribe and dispense self-administered
6 hormonal contraceptives”.

7 **4.** Page 3, line 7: delete the material beginning with “prescribing” and ending
8 with “contraceptives” on line 8 and substitute “prescribing of injectable hormonal
9 contraceptives and self-administered hormonal contraceptives”.

10 **5.** Page 3, line 17: delete the material beginning with “prescribing” and ending
11 with “contraceptive” on line 18 and substitute “prescribing the injectable hormonal
12 contraceptive or self-administered hormonal contraceptive”.

13 **6.** Page 3, line 19: delete the material beginning with that line and ending with
14 page 4, line 6, and substitute:

15 “b. Report to the patient’s primary care practitioner upon prescribing and
16 dispensing the self-administered hormonal contraceptive or upon prescribing and
17 administering the injectable hormonal contraceptive.

18 c. Provide the patient with a written record of the self-administered hormonal
19 contraceptive prescribed and dispensed or the injectable hormonal contraceptive
20 prescribed and administered.

21 d. As soon as practicable after the pharmacist issues the prescription order,
22 dispense the self-administered hormonal contraceptive to the patient or administer
23 the injectable hormonal contraceptive to the patient.
