BEECUTIVE ORDER -/

PROVIDING FOR THE HAINTEMANCE OF LAW AND ORDER IN THE STATE OF WISCONSIN, CITY OF MADISON, AND ON THE STATE CAPITOL BUILDING AND GROUNDS

Wisconsin, other reliable State officials, officers of the National Guard on duty on the State Capital grounds, and law enforcement officials of the City of Madison and Dana County have advised me that the conditions of demostic violence, disorder, and resistance to the execution of the laws of this State continue to exist; and

WHEREAS, such acts of violence and resistance to the law threaten the safety of the State Capital Building and grounds and prevent the continuance of normal governmental functions on those pranises;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, WARREN P. KNOWLES, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby order the following, effective from 4:30 p.m., October 2, 1969, until my further notice:

- It is ordered that loitering, sleeping, or camping enywhere on the Capitol grounds is prohibited.
- 2. It is further ordered that the presence on the State Capitol grounds of persons not employed at the State Capitol or on official and necessary business as determined by the reasonable guidelines cotablished by the Department of Administration, or duly authorized law enforcement officers engaged in the policing of the State Capitol building and its grounds, is probibited.
