EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 59

WHEREAS, a vacancy exists in the office of the Municipal Judge for the Village of Belleville, in the counties of Dane and Green, State of Wisconsin, as a result of the resignation of Robert L. Belle, whose term of office would have expired on April 30, 1982;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, LEE SHERMAN DREYFUS, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 8.50, Wisconsin Statutes, do hereby order that a Special Election, to fill the existing vacancy, be held.

IF, nomination for such office is to be accomplished by the circulation of nomination papers, then the Special Election shall be held on May 5, 1981. The circulation of nominating papers for candidates may commence on January 28, 1981, the deadline for filing nomination papers for candidates shall be 5:00 P.M., March 10, 1981. The special primary shall be held on April 7, 1981. Voting machine recorders may be reactivated 14 days after the special primary unless there is litigation pending, a demand for a recount or notice of an election contest in which case paper ballots may be used for the special election.

IF, nomination for such office is to be accomplished by the holding of a nominating caucus, then the nominating caucus shall be held in accordance with Section 8.05(1) of the Wisconsin Statutes on or before February 17, 1981, and the Special Election shall be held on April 7, 1981.

AND, the election shall be noticed, held, conducted, canvassed, and returned in accordance with the law.
