## EXECUTIVE ORDER #134

Relating to a Special Election for the Fiftieth State Assembly District

WHEREAS, State Representative Dale Schultz was elected on September 24, 1991 as Senator to fill the 17th Senate District, and

WHEREAS, State Representative Dale Schultz has resigned as a State Representative for the Fiftieth Assembly District effective October 7, 1991:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Wisconsin Statute § 8.50 order that a special election be held on December 10, 1991 to fill the vacancy in the Fiftieth Assembly District as described in Wis. Stats. § 4.50 for a term expiring the day preceding the first Monday in January, 1993, and that if a primary is necessary, it be held on November 12, 1991. Circulation of nomination papers for candidates may begin on the date of this order and nomination papers may be filed no later than 5:00 p.m., October 15, 1991. This election shall be held, conducted, canvassed and returned in accordance with law.
