

EXECUTIVE ORDER #162

Proclamation of a State of Emergency and Order to Limited Service of the Wisconsin National Guard

WHEREAS, heavy rains occurred in Wisconsin on September 14, 1992, causing flooding in Richland, Vernon, Columbia and Sauk Counties and Executive Order #161 was signed declaring an emergency in those counties; and

WHEREAS, heavy rains and flooding harr continued and have affected much of Central and Southern Wiscon. \cdots ,

WHEREAS, the flooding and damage have been so extensive that a county by county flood designation is impractical;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this State, and specifically by Wisconsin Statute section 14.019, do hereby:

Extend Executive Order #161 to cover the entire southern one-half of Wisconsin, and direct the Wisconsin National Guard and the Division of Emergency Government to assist state and local government agencies in taking whatever actions within the state that are necessary to aid in the recovery of said flooding.
