

EXECUTIVE ORDER #172

Relating to a Special Election for the Twenty-Seventh State Senate District

WHEREAS, State Senator Russell D. Feingold submitted his resignation as a State Senator for the Twenty-seventh Senate District, effective January 5, 1993 at 12:00 noon, to become a member of the Senate of the United States.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Wisconsin Statute section 8.50 order that a special election be held on April 6, 1993 to fill the vacancy in the Twenty-seventh Senate District as described in Wis. Stats. s.4.009 (27) for a term expiring the day preceding the first Monday in January, 1995; and that if a primary is necessary, it be held on February 16, 1993. Circulation of nomination papers for candidates may begin on the date of this order and nomination papers may be filed no later than 5:00 p.m., January 12, 1993. This section shall be held, conducted, canvassed and returned in accordance with law.
