EXECUTIVE ORDER #192

Proclamation of a State of Emergency and Order to  
Limited Service of the Wisconsin National Guard

WHEREAS, heavy rains occurred in Wisconsin in June, 1993,  
causing flooding in Jackson and Clark Counties; and


WHEREAS, several areas of Jackson County were evacuated and  
emergency shelter was required;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State  
of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution  
and the laws of this State, and specifically by Wisconsin Statute  
section 166.03 (1)(b)(1) and 21.11 (1), do hereby:


Declare a State of Emergency, effective June 20, 1993, in  
Jackson and Clark Counties and direct the Wisconsin National Guard  
and the Division of Emergency Government to assist state and local  
government agencies in taking whatever actions within the state  
that are necessary to aid in the recovery of said flooding.
