EXECUTIVE ORDER # 52


WHEREAS, on Saturday, May 15, 2004, Kenosha Police Officer Dreux M. Beaulier died while on duty, shortly after arresting and transporting a subject to the Kenosha Police Department; and

WHEREAS, Officer Dreux M. Beaulier served the people of the City of Kenosha and the people of Wisconsin with distinction and honor as a member of the Kenosha Police Department and the Wisconsin Army National Guard, Company B, 2nd Battalion, 127th Infantry; and

WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Officer Dreux M. Beaulier; and

WHEREAS, Officer Dreux M. Beaulier will be laid to rest on Thursday, May 20, 2004;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on Thursday, May 20, 2004 and ending at sunset on that date.
