

EXECUTIVE ORDER # 63

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Staff Sergeant Charles Kiser of the U.S. Army Reserve Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom


WHEREAS, on June 24, 2004, Staff Sergeant Charles Kiser, a member of the 330th Military Police Detachment, U.S. Army Reserve, was killed in Mosul, Iraq; and

WHEREAS, Staff Sergeant Charles Kiser provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Staff Sergeant Charles Kiser; and

WHEREAS, a funeral service will be held for Staff Sergeant Charles Kiser Thursday, July 1, 2004;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on Thursday, July 1, 2004, and ending at sunset on that date.
