

EXECUTIVE ORDER # 126

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Sergeant Andrew Wallace of the Wisconsin Army National Guard Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom


WHEREAS, on September 26, 2005, Sergeant Andrew Wallace, a member of Company C, 2nd Battalion, 127th Infantry, 32nd Infantry Brigade, Wisconsin Army National Guard, was killed in action in Iraq; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Andrew Wallace provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Sergeant Andrew Wallace; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Andrew Wallace will be laid to rest on Thursday, October 6, 2005;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on October 6, 2005, and ending at sunset on that date.
