

## **EXECUTIVE ORDER #258**

## Proclamation of a State of Emergency Relating to the Inspection of Dams

WHEREAS, beginning on June 7, 2008 widespread and continuing severe thunderstorms producing torrential rain, damaging winds, large hail and tornadoes have caused widespread flooding in the State of Wisconsin amounting to a natural disaster; and


WHEREAS, the widespread flooding has caused potential damage to dams, including those located on private property, that may cause substantial damage to persons and property in the State of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, this potential for substantial damage creates a need to inspect dams, including those located on private property, to promote safety and protect life, health and property in the State of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, allowing for the emergency inspection of dams is deemed necessary for the security of persons and property in the State of Wisconsin;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jim Doyle**, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this state of Wisconsin, specifically by Sections 166.03(1)(b)1, and 166.03(1)(b)5, and 31.02(3) of the Wisconsin Statutes, do hereby:

- 1. Proclaim that a State of Emergency exists in the State of Wisconsin with regard to dams, including those located on private property; and
- 2. Order that the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and its agents inspect any dam, including those located on private property, to ensure the security of persons and property. The Department may undertake the inspection without the prior consent of the owner, if necessary.
