

EXECUTIVE ORDER # 320

Relating to a Declaration of a State of Emergency

WHEREAS, on June 21 and June 22, 2010, severe thunderstorms, strong winds and a level F2 tornado caused damage in Waukesha County, forcing persons from their homes, damaging or destroying dozens of residences and other structures, and causing extensive power outages; and

WHEREAS, area emergency responders from fire, law enforcement, and emergency medical services responded to these storms and tornadoes, including staff from Wisconsin Emergency Management and the Department of Natural Resources; and

WHEREAS, additional personnel and resources are needed to expedite the response and recovery operations in the affected area;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jim Doyle, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this state, and specifically by Section 323.10 of the Wisconsin Statutes, do hereby:

- 1. Declare that a State of Emergency exists in Waukesha County resulting from the disaster; and
- 2. Direct all state agencies of the State of Wisconsin to assist the above referenced county as appropriate in this response and recovery effort.
