2021 Wisconsin Act 140 [2021 Senate Bill 229]

Refusing, Resisting, or Obstructing the Installation of a GPS Tracking Device

BACKGROUND

Under state law, the Department of Corrections (DOC) monitors the whereabouts of individuals who are subject to global position system (GPS) tracking for the following reasons:

- The person was ordered to submit to monitoring upon conviction for knowingly violating a domestic abuse or harassment temporary restraining order or injunction.
- The person is subject to GPS tracking as a condition of extended supervision.
- The person is subject to GPS tracking as a consequence of committing certain sex offenses.

State law also provides that it is a Class I felony to intentionally tamper with, or block, diffuse, or prevent the clear reception of, a signal transmitted by a GPS tracking device or comparable technology that is provided in connection with DOC's GPS tracking of certain offenders, as described above.

2021 WISCONSIN ACT 140

2021 Wisconsin Act 140 provides that it is also a Class I felony to knowingly refuse, resist, or obstruct the installation of a GPS tracking device or comparable technology that is provided in connection with DOC's GPS tracking of certain offenders.
