2021 Assembly Bill 20

Assembly Amendment 1

2021 ASSEMBLY BILL 20

2021 Assembly Bill 20 lowers the age at which a person may obtain an instruction permit to operate a motor vehicle from 15 years and six months to 15 years. The bill also lengthens the amount of time for which an instruction period is valid from 12 months to 18 months.

ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1

Assembly Amendment 1 increases the number of hours of behind-the-wheel practice an individual who is under the age of 18 must have accumulated before he or she may be issued a license to operate Class D motor vehicles. Under current law, a person who is under the age of 18 must have accumulated 30 hours of behind-the-wheel practice, at least 10 of which must have been during hours of darkness, before he or she may be issued a license to operate Class D motor vehicles. Assembly Amendment 1 increases the number of hours of behind-the-wheel practice a person must have to 50.

BILL HISTORY

Representative Pronschinske offered Assembly Amendment 1 on March 22, 2021. On April 27, 2021, the Assembly Committee on Transportation recommended adoption of Assembly Amendment 1 on a vote of Ayes, 13; Noes, 0. The committee then recommended passage of the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 12; Noes, 2.
