1 **Relating to:** the bombing of the federal building in Oklahoma City.

2 Whereas, on April 19, 1995, at 9:02 a.m. the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building
3 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, was destroyed and the lives of hundreds of innocent
4 people were altered forever by this senseless act of violence; and

5 Whereas, over 150 people, many of whom were children, lost their lives in the
6 bombing and countless more were injured; and

7 Whereas, 2 of these victims spent part of their lives in Wisconsin: Peter De
8 Master, formerly of Sheboygan, and Julie Welch, a 1994 graduate of Marquette
9 University; and

10 Whereas, this was an attempt to destroy the very fabric of our American
11 heritage and replace it with fear and intolerance; and

12 Whereas, instead this tragedy has brought the nation closer together as we
13 mourn for the victims and comfort their families, applaud the heroism of the rescuers
14 and attempt to bring the culprits to justice; and

15 Whereas, in this time of mourning the citizens of Wisconsin remember a similar
16 act of violence that occurred on the University of Wisconsin-Madison campus during
17 the Vietnam War; and
