POTTER, GROBSCHMIDT, BRESKE, WIRCH, GEORGE, FARROW, DRZEWIECKI and HUELSMAN, cosponsored by Representatives HEBL, TRAVIS, GRONEMUS, MUSSER, KRUG, RYBA, MURAT, PLOUFF, R. YOUNG, BOCK, BOYLE, R. 2 Whereas, Norway, which means “Northern Way”, is the 5th largest country in
3 Europe, covering 125,052 square miles, and has a population of approximately
4 4,000,000; and

5 Whereas, Norwegian immigrants have made countless contributions to the
6 cultures of Wisconsin and other regions of the United States; and

7 Whereas, the Norwegian Constitution is the 3rd oldest in the world, being
8 predated only by the constitutions of the United States and France; and

9 Whereas, “Syttende Mai”, which is Norwegian for “May 17”, celebrates the
10 anniversary of the 1814 signing of the Norwegian Constitution that declared
11 Norway’s independence; and

12 Whereas, Norwegian culture can be found throughout Wisconsin in little shops,
13 cafes and restaurants, such as the Norske Nook in Osseo, and is celebrated by a
14 number of communities’ Norwegian Days; and
