



2001 ASSEMBLY BILL 211

March 15, 2001 – Introduced by Representatives OWENS, WALKER, KESTELL, POWERS, BLACK, STONE, KRAWCZYK, OTT, AINSWORTH, LOEFFELHOLZ, J. LEHMAN, BERCEAU, JESKEWITZ, LASSA, KREUSER, SYKORA, TOWNSEND and FRISKE, cosponsored by Senators ROESSLER and DARLING. Referred to Committee on Highway Safety.

1 **AN ACT to amend** 346.57 (4) (b) of the statutes; **relating to:** the speed limit at
2 certain intersections marked with school crossing signs and providing a
3 penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law requires a motorist approaching an intersection marked with a “school crossing” sign to slow to 15 miles per hour or slower when children are present.

This bill requires a motorist approaching an intersection marked with a “school crossing” sign to slow to 15 miles per hour or slower when any child or any school crossing guard is present.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

4 **SECTION 1.** 346.57 (4) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:
5 346.57 (4) (b) Fifteen miles per hour when passing an intersection properly
6 marked with a “school crossing” sign of a type approved by the department when
7 ~~children are~~ any child or a school crossing guard is present.
