



## 2001 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 17

January 25, 2001 – Introduced by COMMITTEE ON RULES. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1     **To create** joint rule 8; **relating to:** fund-raising social events in Dane County  
2             during floorperiods and special and extraordinary sessions.

*Joint Rule 8:* This rule is created to address fund-raising social events in Dane County during floorperiods and special and extraordinary sessions.

3             **Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That:**

4             **SECTION 1.** Joint rule 8 is created to read:

5             **JOINT RULE 8. Campaign committee activity.** (1) A member may not  
6             schedule, hold, attend, or contribute money for or at; or authorize a legislative  
7             campaign committee, as defined in section 11.01 of the statutes, to schedule, hold,  
8             attend, or contribute money for or at; and a member may not schedule, hold, attend,  
9             or contribute money for or at; or authorize the member's personal campaign  
10            committee, as defined in section 11.01 of the statutes, to schedule, hold, attend, or  
11            contribute money for or at; a fund-raising social event in Dane County during a  
12            floorperiod of the legislature or during a special or extraordinary session.

1 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to a fund-raising social event of a legislative  
2 campaign committee held during the period between the first day authorized for  
3 filing nomination papers for any special election to the senate or assembly and the  
4 date of the special election.

5 (3) Subsection (1) does not apply to a fund-raising social event of a current  
6 member of the senate or assembly or his or her personal campaign committee held  
7 during the period between the first day authorized for filing nomination papers for  
8 any office for which a current member of the senate or assembly is a candidate and  
9 the date of the election for that office, if the event is held within the boundaries of  
10 the jurisdiction or district served by the office for which the current member of the  
11 senate or assembly is a candidate.

12 (4) Subsection (1) does not apply to a fund-raising social event of a current  
13 member of the senate or assembly or his or her personal campaign committee held  
14 during the period between the first day authorized for filing nomination papers for  
15 any office, other than senator, for which a current member of the senate is a  
16 candidate and the date of the election for that other office, or other than  
17 representative to the assembly, for which a current member of the assembly is a  
18 candidate and the date of the election for that other office.
