



2001 SENATE BILL 243

September 20, 2001 - Introduced by Senators ERPENBACH and GROBSCHMIDT.
Referred to Committee on Education.

1 **AN ACT** *to create* 121.91 (4) (i) of the statutes; **relating to:** increasing a school
2 district's revenue limit for the costs of teaching school professional staff how to
3 use digital technology and distance-learning technology.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law generally limits the increase in the total amount of revenue that a school district may receive from general school aids and property taxes to approximately \$220 per pupil in the 2000-01 school year and, in subsequent school years, to the amount of revenue increase allowed per pupil in the previous school year increased by the percentage change in the consumer price index. This bill increases a school district's revenue limit by an amount equal to the costs of teaching school professional staff how to use digital technology and distance-learning technology to promote learning.

4 **SECTION 1.** 121.91 (4) (i) of the statutes is created to read:

3 **SECTION 2. Initial applicability.**

4 (1) This act first applies to the calculation of a school district's revenue limit
5 in the school year beginning after the effective date of this subsection.
