AN ACT to repeal and recreate 119.23 (2) (a) 6. of the statutes; relating to:
requirements for teachers and administrators employed by a private school
participating in the Milwaukee Parental Choice Program.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Beginning July 1, 2006, current law requires all teachers employed by a private school participating in the Milwaukee Parental Choice Program (MPCP) to have a high school diploma.

This bill requires all teachers employed by an MPCP school to have at least an associate degree or be enrolled in a program leading to at least an associate degree, and all administrators employed by an MPCP school to have at least four years of post–secondary education.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 119.23 (2) (a) 6. of the statutes, as created by 2005 Wisconsin Act 25, is repealed and recreated to read:
- 6 119.23 **(2)** (a) 6. All of the private school's teachers have at least an associate degree or are enrolled in a program leading to at least an associate degree, and all
