1 **Relating to:** proclaiming the month of October as Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

2 Whereas, the American Cancer Society reports that breast cancer is the most
3 frequently diagnosed cancer in Wisconsin women; and

4 Whereas, breast cancer is the 2nd leading cause of cancer death in Wisconsin
5 women; and

6 Whereas, this year there will be 211,240 new cases of breast cancer and 40,410
7 deaths from breast cancer in the United States and 4,130 new cases of breast cancer
8 and 790 deaths from breast cancer in Wisconsin; and

9 Whereas, the American Cancer Society recommends yearly mammograms for
10 women beginning at age 40 and clinical breast exams every 3 years for women in
11 their 20s and 30s; and

12 Whereas, the recent declines in breast cancer mortality have been attributed
13 to the regular use of screening mammography and to improvements in treatment;
