



## 2013 ASSEMBLY BILL 642

January 21, 2014 – Introduced by Representatives JACQUE, BERCEAU, BIES and A. OTT, cosponsored by Senators SCHULTZ, LASSA and LEHMAN. Referred to Committee on State Affairs and Government Operations.

1     **AN ACT** *to create* 125.68 (14) of the statutes; **relating to:** the sale, of  
2           high-concentration alcohol beverages and providing penalties.

### *Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau*

This bill prohibits the sale of intoxicating liquor containing 95 percent or more of alcohol by volume (190 proof or higher). A person who sells intoxicating liquor in violation of this prohibition may be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than nine months or both.

Because this bill creates a new crime or revises a penalty for an existing crime, the Joint Review Committee on Criminal Penalties may be requested to prepare a report concerning the proposed penalty and the costs or savings that are likely to result if the bill is enacted.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

3           **SECTION 1.** 125.68 (14) of the statutes is created to read:  
4           125.68 (14) HIGH-CONCENTRATION ALCOHOL BEVERAGES. (a) No person may sell  
5           intoxicating liquor containing 95 percent or more of alcohol by volume.
