2017 ASSEMBLY BILL 601

October 27, 2017 - Introduced by Representatives E. Brooks, R. Brooks, Kleefisch, Kulp, Tittl and Tusler, cosponsored by Senators Wanggaard, Harsdorf, Marklein and Olsen. Referred to Committee on Corrections.

AN ACT to amend 301.48 (3) (b) and 301.49 (3) (b) of the statutes; relating to: length of contracts for GPS devices for tracking sex offenders and persons who violated injunctions.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law requires the Department of Corrections to monitor using a global positioning system tracking device certain sex offenders and persons who have violated certain injunctions. DOC must contract with a vendor for installation and maintenance of the GPS equipment, and current law limits the term of each contract to three years. Under this bill, the term is limited to seven years.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 301.48 (3) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:
301.48 (3) (b) The department shall contract with a vendor using a competitive process under s. 16.75 to provide staff in this state to install, remove, and maintain equipment related to global positioning system tracking and passive positioning
system tracking for purposes of this section. The term of the contract may not exceed 3-7 years.

SECTION 2. 301.49 (3) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:
301.49 (3) (b) The department shall contract with a vendor using a competitive process as described under s. 16.75 to provide staff in this state to install, remove, and maintain equipment related to global positioning system tracking for purposes of this section. The term of the contract may not exceed $-\underline{7}$ years.

## SECTION 3. Initial applicability.

(1) This act first applies to contracts entered into, modified, or renewed on the effective date of this subsection.
