2019 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 31

April 25, 2019 - Introduced by Representatives Vorpagel, Riemer, Anderson, Bowen, Dittrich, Duchow, Ohnstad, Sargent, Sinicki, Spreitzer, Steffen, Stubbs, Subeck, Thiesfeldt and Tusler, cosponsored by Senators Feyen, Hansen, Carpenter, Cowles and Olsen. Referred to Committee on Rules.

Relating to: recognizing September 1 to 7, 2019, as Resiliency Week.

Whereas, hazard mitigation is the effort to reduce loss of life and property by lessening the impact of disasters. It is most effective when implemented under a comprehensive, long-term mitigation plan; and

Whereas, the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant Program, administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency, is designed to assist states and local communities in implementing a sustained pre-disaster natural hazard mitigation program; and

Whereas, federal legislation recently enacted, the Disaster Recovery Reform Act, makes available new dollars for states and communities to undertake pre-disaster mitigation measures and creates new incentives for states to build resiliently; and

Whereas, since 1908, natural disasters have cost the country more than one trillion dollars; and

1	Whereas, disasters affect the local and state economies in lost payrolls, lost
2	sales and income tax, and increased disaster recovery times; and
3	Whereas, according to a FEMA commissioned study conducted by the National
4	Institute of Building Sciences, every \$1 spent on hazard mitigation provides the
5	nation with \$6 in future benefits; and
6	Whereas, 25 percent of small businesses that are impacted by a natural disaster
7	never reopen their doors; and
8	Whereas, September is National Preparedness Month and Wisconsin
9	Preparedness Month in recognition of the need for all Americans to prepare and plan
10	for recovery after a disaster; and
11	Whereas, mitigation planning is a key process used to break the cycle of
12	disaster damage, reconstruction, and repeated damage; and
13	Whereas, effective pre-disaster mitigation reduces the demand for relief
14	services on volunteer organizations such as disaster rescue and recovery teams,
15	along with food banks and homeless shelters who serve our communities by changing
16	their operations to provide additional services to those affected by disaster; and
17	Whereas, this legislative body honors the brave men and women who, as first
18	responders, selflessly provide aid in a disaster to safeguard Wisconsin citizens; and
19	Whereas, this legislative body encourages Wisconsin communities to build
20	resiliently and develop long-range mitigation strategies for protecting people and
21	property from future hazard events; now, therefore, be it
22	Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the Wisconsin
23	Legislature declares the week of September 1 to 7, 2019, as Resiliency Week to raise

- 2 instituting a pre-disaster mitigation strategy.
