2023 SENATE BILL 964

January 26, 2024 - Introduced by Senators BALLWEG, COWLES and TESTIN, cosponsored by Representatives TITTL, BEHNKE, CONLEY, DITTRICH, MURPHY, MYERS, SINICKI, SNODGRASS, STUBBS, SUBECK and WICHGERS. Referred to Committee on Transportation and Local Government.

1 **AN ACT** *to amend* 341.14 (1a), 341.14 (1e) (a), 341.14 (1m), 341.14 (1q), 343.51
2 (1) and 343.62 (4) (a) 4. of the statutes; **relating to:** authorizing physical
3 therapists to make certifications for acquiring disabled parking plates and
4 cards.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill authorizes physical therapists to certify to the Department of Transportation information necessary for a person to acquire a disabled parking plate or card.

Under current law, a person with a disability that limits or impairs the ability to walk may apply for and obtain from DOT special motor vehicle registration plates or a special identification card entitling a motor vehicle used by the person to certain parking privileges, including parking in spaces reserved for such vehicles. An application for the special plate or card must contain required information from a licensed physician, advanced practice nurse, public health nurse, physician assistant, podiatrist, chiropractor, Christian Science practitioner, or the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

1 **SECTION 1.** 341.14 (1a) of the statutes is amended to read:

2 341.14 **(1a)** If any resident of this state, who is registering or has registered an
3 automobile, or a motor truck, dual purpose motor home or dual purpose farm truck
4 which has a gross weight of not more than 8,000 pounds, a farm truck which has a
5 gross weight of not more than 12,000 pounds or a motor home, submits a statement
6 once every 4 years, as determined by the department, from a physician licensed to
7 practice medicine in any state, from an advanced practice nurse licensed to practice
8 nursing in any state, from a public health nurse certified or licensed to practice in
9 any state, from a physician assistant licensed or certified to practice in any state,
10 from a podiatrist licensed to practice in any state, from a chiropractor licensed to
11 practice chiropractic in any state, from a physical therapist licensed to practice in
12 any state, or from a Christian Science practitioner residing in this state and listed
13 in the Christian Science journal certifying to the department that the resident is a
14 person with a disability that limits or impairs the ability to walk, the department
15 shall procure, issue and deliver to the disabled person plates of a special design in
16 lieu of plates which ordinarily would be issued for the vehicle, and shall renew the
17 plates. The plates shall be so designed as to readily apprise law enforcement officers
18 of the fact that the vehicle is owned by a nonveteran disabled person and is entitled
19 to the parking privileges specified in s. 346.50 (2a). No charge in addition to the
20 registration fee shall be made for the issuance or renewal of such plates.

21 **SECTION 2.** 341.14 (1e) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

22 341.14 **(1e)** (a) If any resident of this state, who is registering or has registered
23 a motorcycle, submits a statement once every 4 years, as determined by the
24 department, from a physician licensed to practice medicine in any state, from an
25 advanced practice nurse licensed to practice nursing in any state, from a public

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1 health nurse certified or licensed to practice in any state, from a physician assistant
2 licensed or certified to practice in any state, from a podiatrist licensed to practice in
3 any state, from a chiropractor licensed to practice chiropractic in any state, from a
4 physical therapist licensed to practice in any state, from a Christian Science
5 practitioner residing in this state and listed in the Christian Science journal, or from
6 the U.S. department of veterans affairs certifying to the department that the
7 resident is a person with a disability that limits or impairs the ability to walk, the
8 department shall procure, issue and deliver to the disabled person a plate of a special
9 design in lieu of the plate which ordinarily would be issued for the motorcycle, and
10 shall renew the plate. The statement shall state whether the disability is permanent
11 or temporary and, if temporary, the opinion of the physician, advanced practice
12 nurse, public health nurse, physician assistant, podiatrist, physical therapist,
13 chiropractor, practitioner, or U.S. department of veterans affairs as to the duration
14 of the disability. The plate shall be so designed as to readily apprise law enforcement
15 officers of the fact that the motorcycle is owned by a disabled person and is entitled
16 to the parking privileges specified in s. 346.50 (2a). No charge in addition to the
17 registration fee may be made for the issuance or renewal of the plate.

18 **SECTION 3.** 341.14 (1m) of the statutes is amended to read:

19 341.14 **(1m)** If any licensed driver submits to the department a statement once
20 every 4 years, as determined by the department, from a physician licensed to practice
21 medicine in any state, from a public health nurse certified or licensed to practice in
22 any state, from an advanced practice nurse licensed to practice nursing in any state,
23 from a physician assistant licensed or certified to practice in any state, from a
24 podiatrist licensed to practice in any state, from a chiropractor licensed to practice
25 chiropractic in any state, from a physical therapist licensed to practice in any state,

1 or from a Christian Science practitioner residing in this state and listed in the
2 Christian Science journal certifying that another person who is regularly dependent
3 on the licensed driver for transportation is a person with a disability that limits or
4 impairs the ability to walk, the department shall issue and deliver to the licensed
5 driver plates of a special design in lieu of the plates which ordinarily would be issued
6 for the automobile or motor truck, dual purpose motor home or dual purpose farm
7 truck having a gross weight of not more than 8,000 pounds, farm truck having a gross
8 weight of not more than 12,000 pounds or motor home, and shall renew the plates.
9 The plates shall be so designed as to readily apprise law enforcement officers of the
10 fact that the vehicle is operated by a licensed driver on whom a disabled person is
11 regularly dependent and is entitled to the parking privileges specified in s. 346.50
12 (2a). No charge in addition to the registration fee may be made for the issuance or
13 renewal of the plates. The plates shall conform to the plates required in sub. (1a).

14 **SECTION 4.** 341.14 (1q) of the statutes is amended to read:

15 341.14 (1q) If any employer who provides an automobile, or a motor truck, dual
16 purpose motor home or dual purpose farm truck which has a gross weight of not more
17 than 8,000 pounds, a farm truck which has a gross weight of not more than 12,000
18 pounds or a motor home, for an employee's use submits to the department a
19 statement once every 4 years, as determined by the department, from a physician
20 licensed to practice medicine in any state, from an advanced practice nurse licensed
21 to practice nursing in any state, from a public health nurse certified or licensed to
22 practice in any state, from a physician assistant licensed or certified to practice in
23 any state, from a podiatrist licensed to practice in any state, from a physical therapist
24 licensed to practice in any state, from a chiropractor licensed to practice chiropractic
25 in any state, or from a Christian Science practitioner residing in this state and listed

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1 in the Christian Science journal certifying that the employee is a person with a
2 disability that limits or impairs the ability to walk, the department shall issue and
3 deliver to such employer plates of a special design in lieu of the plates which
4 ordinarily would be issued for the vehicle, and shall renew the plates. The plates
5 shall be so designed as to readily apprise law enforcement officers of the fact that the
6 vehicle is operated by a disabled person and is entitled to the parking privileges
7 specified in s. 346.50 (2a). No charge in addition to the registration fee may be made
8 for the issuance or renewal of the plates. The plates shall conform to the plates
9 required in sub. (1a).

10 **SECTION 5.** 343.51 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

11 343.51 (1) Any person who qualifies for registration plates of a special design
12 under s. 341.14 (1), (1a), (1m), or (1q) or any other person with a disability that limits
13 or impairs the ability to walk may request from the department a special
14 identification card that will entitle any motor vehicle parked by, or under the
15 direction of, the person, or a motor vehicle operated by or on behalf of the
16 organization when used to transport such a person, to parking privileges under s.
17 346.50 (2), (2a), and (3). The department shall issue the card at a fee to be determined
18 by the department, upon submission by the applicant, if the applicant is an
19 individual rather than an organization, of a statement from a physician licensed to
20 practice medicine in any state, from an advanced practice nurse licensed to practice
21 nursing in any state, from a public health nurse certified or licensed to practice in
22 any state, from a physician assistant licensed or certified to practice in any state,
23 from a podiatrist licensed to practice in any state, from a chiropractor licensed to
24 practice chiropractic in any state, from a physical therapist licensed to practice in
25 any state, or from a Christian Science practitioner residing in this state and listed

1 in the Christian Science journal that the person is a person with a disability that
2 limits or impairs the ability to walk. The statement shall state whether the disability
3 is permanent or temporary and, if temporary, the opinion of the physician, advanced
4 practice nurse, public health nurse, physician assistant, podiatrist, physical
5 therapist, chiropractor, or practitioner as to the duration of the disability. The
6 department shall issue the card upon application by an organization on a form
7 prescribed by the department if the department believes that the organization meets
8 the requirements under this subsection.

9 **SECTION 6.** 343.62 (4) (a) 4. of the statutes is amended to read:

10 343.62 (4) (a) 4. The applicant submits with the application a statement
11 completed within the immediately preceding 24 months, except as provided by rule,
12 by a physician licensed to practice medicine in any state, from an advanced practice
13 nurse licensed to practice nursing in any state, from a physician assistant licensed
14 or certified to practice in any state, from a podiatrist licensed to practice in any state,
15 from a chiropractor licensed to practice chiropractic in any state, from a physical
16 therapist licensed to practice in any state, or from a Christian Science practitioner
17 residing in this state, and listed in the Christian Science journal certifying that, in
18 the medical care provider's judgment, the applicant is physically fit to teach driving.
